Mercer/Marshall Street Reconstruction Project

Storm water management and accessibility improvements

are going ahead on Mercer Street and Marshall Street. The new works will significantly reduce the volume of surface water previously experienced by residents in this area, while also improving access for all road users.

Blakeney Bridge Replacement

A new bridge is coming to Blakeney; Lanark County Council awarded the tender for the replacement of the Blakeney Bridge to Looby Builders (Dublin) Limited for \$3.06 million plus HST.

Taking Blakeney residents' concerns regarding pedestrian safety into consideration, the Municipality of Mississippi Mills will be contributing \$195,500 to the project to have the bridge accommodate pedestrians.

With this funding from the Municipality, the widened bridge will feature an accessible 1.6m walkway protected by flexible bollards. The two-lane bridge will also be able to accommodate

agriculture equipment, supporting farmers in the area.

Union Street North Rehabilitation Project

Supporting the future development in the Town of Almonte, a rehabilitation project is underway on Union Street North from Carss Street to Main Street East.

This project was identified as necessary in the 2018 Water and Wastewater Master Plan, and will feature the replacement of watermains, sewers and services to the property line, road reconstruction, and new curbs and sidewalks.

Every Second Counts: Mississippi Mills Fire Department Launches New Program

Information is vital to a quick and effective rescue mission.

Knowing this, the Mississippi Mills Fire Department has launched their online preparedness platform Community Connect. Residents can now help their firefighters respond in case of an emergency on their property by providing information on their property type, number of occupants, and more in advance. This information is only accessed during an emergency and is securely stored on bank level encrypted servers. Having this information beforehand means firefighters know to save your pets, your property, and your loved ones, even in a situation where you may not be capable to relay that information.

Background:

After the amalgamation of Pakenham, Ramsay and Almonte, a new Community Official Plan was approved in 2006 to reflect the uniqueness of the different areas, including the agricultural and rural areas and rural villages of each (former) Municipality.

Since 2006, there have been many changes in Mississippi Mills. Inter-provincial migration, changes in the agricultural sector, a COVID-induced real estate market, provincial planning changes and a housing supply/affordability crisis have all had effects on the rural and agricultural areas of the Municipality. The effective management of growth and change is the upmost importance to ensure the social, economic and environmental viability of a Municipality. With a changing rural and agricultural landscape, updated population projections anticipated by

Lanark County, and a focus on the viability of rural areas and villages, there is a need to ensure that the Official Plan and Zoning By-law are up to date with current planning trends. The updated plans and by-laws shall reflect the most current best practices to support one of the backbones of Mississippi Mills - *its Rural Villages and Rural Vitality*.

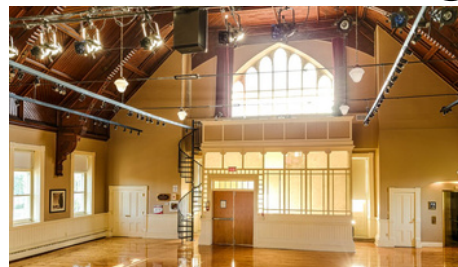

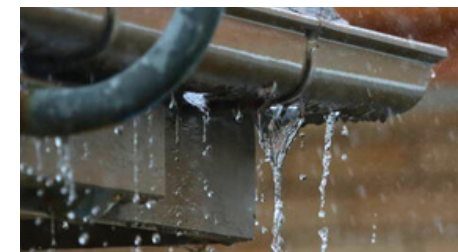

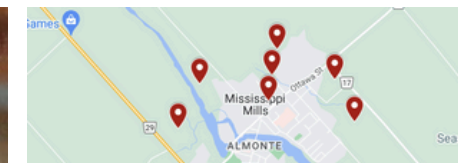
The Low Down on Lot Grading and Drainage

Have you ever looked at your yard and thought, "Hmm... Why is it slanted like that? I should make it flat."

If you have, we have something for you! The **Homeowner's Guide to Lot Grading and Drainage** is now available on Mississippi Mills' website. The guide is simple and easy to comprehend, helping readers better understand the inconspicuous work that goes into protecting your home from floods and how you can further protect your home from water damage.

If you choose not to read the guide, at least know this: The slope of your yard is likely designed that way, so please don't modify it. If you must modify it, please get in contact with the Municipality before getting started. Failure to do so may result in Administrative Monetary Penalties (AMPs).

Building Fees Updated For 2024

The new Building By-law and its associated building fees took effect on May 8, 2024. The new fees (By-law 24-024) can be found under Building and Renovating on the municipal website.

Some key changes include:

- Changes to the application timeline.
- Industrial, commercial, and institutional permit fees are now based on cost of construction.

The fees fund the Building Department so that tax payers do not have to pay for the operation of the Building Department.

FAQ: Building Questions

Do I need to contact the Municipality to cut down my tree?
The Municipality only has a Tree By-law regarding trees on municipal property (By-law 02-99), but please contact us for guidance to ensure you don't cut down a municipal tree.

Does the Municipality have a By-law for fences?

No, but there are still rules to follow such as setbacks, easements, and maximum fence heights. Please consult the Municipality if you have any questions.

How do I find out what my property is zoned as?

Please visit the Planning and Land Use page under Build and Invest on the municipal website, where you will find a comprehensive map of all the zones in Mississippi Mills.

Cool Places To Cool Down This Summer

With another hot summer on the way, it's essential to find ways to stay cool and avoid heat-related illnesses. Fortunately, we know the coolest places in the community for you to check out!

Mississippi Mills is home to **two refreshing beaches**; Almonte Beach (195 Water St.) and Pakenham Beach (106 Margaret St.). Both are equipped with public washrooms. Please note that both beaches are unsupervised; swim at your own risk. The Leeds, Grenville and Lanark Health Unit updates the water condition status weekly.

If the beach is closed, another great alternative place to combat the heat is the **splash pad** in Gemmill Park. Open 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily during the summer, the splash pad also has washrooms and a water fountain onsite, as well as picnic tables and shaded areas.

Thanks to water evaporation, you should feel a nice temperature difference just by being near these areas (but of course, feel free to play, too).
